COMMON REPORTING STANDARD

The Common Reporting Standard (CRS) is the result of the efforts by the G20 nations to develop a global Standard for the Automatic Exchange of Information (AEOI). AEOI is about improving transparency in the fight against tax evasion and thus protecting the integrity of the tax systems of the participating jurisdictions.

Rhone Trust and Fiduciary Services SA and all its entities are committed to implementing the necessary requirements to fulfil the standard and will start exchanging data in 2018

Under the Personal Data Protection Act 2012 (PDPA), organisations are required to develop and implement policies and practices that are necessary to meet its obligations under the PDPA. In particular, organisations are required to designate at least one individual, known as the data protection officer (DPO), to oversee the data protection responsibilities within the organisation and ensure compliance with the PDPA.
